I sent this email to Doug yesterday (see below and attached) and discussed it further with him this am on the telephone. Doug,

I am working on a very difficult case involving a police officer from covert pd who while on duty arrested a drunk driver and at the same time while taking the drunk driver to jail he took the drunk passenger back to his hotel room where he later had sex with her. The difficult issue is can we prove that she was too drunk to give consent? I have hired an

expert, Dr. Dennis Simpson to help me in court. He is a professor at WMU. He donates his earnings to charity. We have a line item for this sort of expense so no worry there.

However, I would like to pay a stipend to one of his graduate students who is basically helping us as an intern on this case. I have \$10,000.00 in part time wages budget and another \$6,000 in overtime wages, neither that I expect to use very much of during this fiscal year. Can I pay him up to \$1,000 stipend based on the circumstances of this case and his involvement? See his attached CV. He is not a relative or friend and I have never met him before. This request is purely to compensate him for his help to me on this case. We will have to submit a 1099 for him and we will cap at \$1,000.

Also, see below for more details regarding highly confidential information regarding this request and the interns expected involvement in this case. You may share the information below to those who are in need to know as it relates to this request, but it is confidential.

Please advise at your soonest possible convenience. I don't see where there would be any issues given the circumstances, but always ask for your approval before I take any steps of this nature. I see this as a very limited internship opportunity and the compensation is minimal considering all things.

Channel 3 has been covering this case every step of the way. There is no guarantee that we will win this case, but I want to make sure we are prepared and doing everything that we can to get the truth out. We have a trial scheduled for 1-18-17, but expect that it will get adjourned to a date in March or April.
